

The Inspiration: Justice

KIBBLE J COCKTAILS

Ten years ago, DFW Rescue ME rushed to the aid of a puppy who would come to be known as "Justice"

Justice was a puppy who was doused with lighter and set on fire fluid by four men in 2011. DFW Rescue ME tried to save this puppy's life, but despite all the efforts, he succumbed to his injuries. While Justice suffered unspeakable acts of cruelty, we chose to focus on the impact his life had. A legacy was born. DFW Rescue Me created the Justice Fund in his honor.

Justice was the first case of animal cruelty prosecuted in Dallas – he paved the way for law enforcement and the legal system to pursue and prosecute cruelty cases. The Justice Fund continues today to provide dogs who are the victims of abuse, or neglect with necessary medical care and the opportunity to know kindness of the human hand. Something they all deserve.

This little puppy changed the lives of so many other dogs and puppies in need. A dog who belonged to no one, suddenly meant so much to everyone.


> Justice lived only a short time. But his memory lives on, so more dogs like him, can have a second chance at a new leash on life.

DFW Rescue Me is a 100% volunteer, all foster-based 501c3 non-profit dog rescue group

An estimated six to eight million dogs and cats are euthanized in shelters each year. Millions more are abandoned, only to suffer from illness or injury before dying. It is the goal of DFW Rescue Me to have a positive impact on those statistics through adoption programs, teaching responsible pet ownership and emphasizing the importance of spaying and neutering to control overpopulation.



Our mission is to provide a 'new leash on life' by finding permanent and loving homes for lost, abused and abandoned dogs.

Since 2011, we have rescued and saved over

3,800 dogs

Over 200 of those were Justice Dogs.

Louis was found matted, dirty and starving. under a bridge in town. Louis had been living there long enough that he was starving and just skin and bones. DFW Rescue Me got him broken and he had given up. Louis is now safe, well fed and loved!



Astrid came to us just skin and bones and also had parvo. Thanks to donations, we were able to get her the treatment she needed to even have a fighting chance. Astrid is grown up now and living the good life.



Eliza came from the local shelter after being run over by a car. She is deaf, so most likely never heard it coming. Eliza's back leg, tail and pelvis were broken. After two blood transfusions, a week in the hospital, Eliza had two surgeries to remove her leg and tail and was deemed healthy!



Maya came to us with not one but two cheery eyes! We were able to get her the surgery needed and now Maya is living the good life with an amazing family.



Greg came from a Dallas shelter because he was unable to walk. His back legs worked, but not his front legs. Doctors determined he was missing parts of his shoulder and elbow joints. A foster started him in physical therapy and within three days, he started walking. Everyone was shocked, except for little Greg!.



Stink came to us he was just a tiny puppy, which is hard to believe since he is still a pretty tiny guy. He was 3 weeks only and only 1/2 a pound! Through foster and medical care, he has grown into an adorable, funny and confident bigger dude.
